



Opening Question: Share a time when you felt included or excluded based on how you looked, what you had, or who you knew? How did that experience affect you?

For Discussion:

- 1. Understanding the Text
- What example does James give to show how favoritism can appear in a church setting?
- According to verses 5–7, why is favoritism especially problematic in God's kingdom?
- 2. Personal Reflection
- In what subtle ways might favoritism show up in our own church or relationships?
- Are there people you naturally gravitate toward or avoid based on what they can do for you?
- 3. Digging Deeper
- James isn't forbidding close friendships or relationships. What's the difference between favoritism and healthy friendship?
- How does Jesus model inclusion and compassion in His relationships? How did He treat the "unseen" or "unimportant"?
- 4. Application
- What would it look like for our church to reflect God's heart for both the rich and the poor?
- How can we practice "loving our neighbor as ourselves" with intentionality this week?

Reflection Challenge:

This week, take a practical step to include someone who may often go unnoticed—whether it's at church, work, school, or in your neighborhood. Ask yourself, "Am I seeing this person as God sees them?"

Prayer Points:

- * Ask God to reveal any favoritism in your heart.
- * Pray for a spirit of humility and openness to all people.

* Lift up your church, that it may be a welcoming space for every person—regardless of wealth, background, or status.
