of God in the weeks ahead.






# Missions Report

To date, our monthly mission articles have explained the home mission fields our church serves. Today, we begin to explore the foreign missions we support. The Denisa Center is located in a small village in rural Romania. This country was one of Europe's poorest, since it came out of Communism in 1989. Today, things are looking brighter for Romanians because of places like the Denisa Center and the loving care they provide for the country's children. Originally, the center was part of Open Arms International, but in recent times it has merged into Stand by Me Ministries (headquartered in the United Kingdom).

The Denisa Center is an after-school program for elementary-aged children. On weekdays, students attend school, which is dismissed at noon. They return home, eat lunch, and around two o'clock a van from the center picks them up. They are transported to the center where they are cared for until their parents' workday is over (approximately three hours).

Presently, around sixty children receive nutritious food, Bible lessons, help with their homework, and tutoring in their school subjects during their time at the center.

Many rural children in Romania do not have access to recreational and cultural activities. These activities are luxuries, so the center has made it their goal to create opportunities to broaden horizons, stimulate imaginations, and enrich these children's lives. They celebrate each child's birthday with a party and, recently, the children were privileged to attend an animated movie at the cinema and stop at MacDonald's afterward for a small treat. Recently, another building was added to accommodate preschool children.
