



Through Herod's Eyes

Icebreaker Question: Have you ever felt threatened by change—even if you knew it might be good? What made it difficult?

Read Matthew 2:1–18 together and listen for contrasts in the passage (fear vs. joy, deception vs. worship, power vs. humility).

Group Discussion

- 1. Understanding Herod's Response: King Herod the Great is described as "disturbed" when he hears about Jesus' birth.
 - Why do you think the birth of Jesus felt threatening to Herod?
 - What was Herod most afraid of losing?
 - How did his position, power, and insecurity shape his response?
- 2. Fear vs. Worship: The Magi respond very differently than Herod.
 - What words describe the Magi's reaction when they find Jesus?
 - How does their posture compare to Herod's?
 - Why do you think joy often accompanies surrender, while fear accompanies control?
- 3. Seeing Ourselves in the Story: Herod's story is uncomfortable because it's relatable.
 - In what areas of life do people today struggle to let Christ be King?
 - What "thrones" do we tend to protect—comfort, reputation, control, certainty?
 - How can fear subtly disguise itself as wisdom, caution, or responsibility?
- 4. A Warning and an Invitation: Herod outwardly claims he wants to worship Jesus but his actions reveal otherwise.
 - Why is it dangerous to say the right things about Jesus while resisting Him inwardly
 - How can we tell the difference between genuine worship and religious performance
 - What does true surrender look like in everyday life?

Application (Personal Reflection)

- Where might Jesus be inviting me to release control?
- What fear do I need to name honestly before God?
- What step of obedience or surrender could I take this week?
